Otherwise ..

Try the webbridge link, labelled as 'more resources' in the university library catalogue, which links to the British Library and Inform25 catalogues.

The British Library is the obvious source for access to other printed and electronic LIS journals. For anything obscure which they do not have, the University Library will be able to tell you if it is available in any other library in the London area, or will be able to arrange interlibrary loan of articles or single issues (for a fee, which is considerable cheaper than a personal ILL).

For an individual article in a journal not accessible to you, it is always worth putting the title into a search engine, to see if the author has self-archived a version on their website. Users of Google Scholar can set City University library in their profile to view where the library has holdings of material retrieved in their hit list.
